ORDER

Sub.: "Amnesty Scheme" for industrial category of consumers for revival of industries - realisation of outstanding dues thereof.

With a view to revive the sick/closed industrial units it has been decided to allow following concessional package for disconnected/running industrial consumers for a period from 25th August, 2001 to 30th September, 2001.

<p>1. <u>Small & Medium Industrial category of consumers (running as well as disconnected)</u></p> <p>Clearance of outstanding dues as on 31.3.2001</p> <p>(i) If the consumer deposit (lumpsum) the total outstanding dues on or before 30.9.2001.</p>	<p>Entire DPS/interest shall be waived off and only principal amount of outstanding shall be recovered.</p>

(ii) If the consumer is unable to make the payment of outstanding dues in lumpsum then he could be given option to deposit 50% of outstanding on or before 30.9.2001 and balance 50% in three equal monthly instalments.	Only 75% DPS/interest shall be waived off.
2. <u>Large Industrial Category</u> A. Clearance of outstanding dues by Industries lying disconnected since or prior to 31.3.2001.	
(i) If the consumer deposit (Lumpsum) the total outstanding dues upto 30.9.2001.	(a) 50% LPS accumulated on dues other than arrear of fuel surcharge prior to disconnected period shall be waived and
	(b) No LPS/interest on outstanding arrears of fuel surcharge shall be charged from date of billing to date of deposit of full amount on or before 30.9.2001. (c) 6% interest per annum on outstanding dues arrived as per (a) above as on date of disconnection to date of depositing dues i.e. upto 30.9.2001 shall be recovered instead of usual interest of 18% p.a.

(b) only 6% interest per annum on outstanding dues arrived as per (a) above as on date of disconnection to date of depositing 50% amount and for balance 50% to be deposited in 6 monthly instalments 9% interest per annum shall be recovered on outstandings till payment of installment.</p>
<p>B. Clearance of outstanding dues as on 31.3.2001 by Industries not lying disconnected. If the consumer deposit (lumpsum) the total outstanding dues on or before 30.9.2001.</p>	<p>50% LPS accumulated on dues other than the outstanding arrears of fuel surcharge upto 31.3.2001 shall be waived and no LPS/ interest shall be charged on amount of arrears of fuel surcharge from date of billing.</p>

Terms & Conditinos

- i) The Scheme shall be made available for a period from 25.8.2001 to 30.9.2001.
- ii) Concerned Asstt. Engineer is empowered for allowing rebate in DPS/Interest for the Small & Medium Industrial category of consumers and for Large Industrial category Addl. Chief Engineer(Comml.) is empowered to allow rebate in LPS/ Interest as per the scheme.
- iii) The scheme shall be applicable irrespective of whether the disconnected consumer wants reconnection or not.
- iv) To avail these concessions the consumer shall voluntarily undertake to withdraw all the Court cases, if any, pending in any court of law/ Consumer Forum/MRTP Commission etc. related to the outstanding dues.

- v) If the consumer fails to deposit the amount as per agreed time schedule under this concessional package, this facility shall be withdrawn.
- vi) These concessional package will not be applicable for the amount of assessment made against theft of electricity or malpractice.
- vii) For availing these concessional package the consumer shall be required to apply with the concerned Asstt. Engineer for the Small & Medium industrial category of consumers and with the Addl. Chief Engineer (Comml.) for the Large Industrial category of consumers in the format enclosed at Annexure-(A).
- viii) These concessional package shall not be applicable for those consumers who have taken benefit of similar schemes of 1999 and or year 2000.
- ix) The outstanding dues should be worked out without taking into consideration the adjustment of existing security deposit. However, adjustment of security deposit may be made for disconnected consumers in the dues so worked out as on date of disconnection and from such consumers revised security deposit shall be obtained as per rules before reconnection, if any.
- x) Since DPS is not separately shown in outstanding dues in SIP & MIP consumers, the DPS shall have to be segregated from the outstanding dues and shall be waived either completely or 75%, as the case may be, as per the scheme. However, where segregation of DPS from the outstanding dues is either not possible or likely to take much time, a rebate shall be allowed in the outstanding dues in lieu of DPS @1% or 0.75% per month, as the case may be, i.e. 1% for cases where complete DPS is to be waived and 0.75% for cases where 75% of DPS is to be waived for the months (reconing number of month(s) after August, 1997 as levy of DPS was started from August, 1997 only) since the dues are outstandings till date of disconnection (for the cases of connections lying disconnected) or till the consumer makes the payment (for running connection i.e. not lying disconnected).
- xi) Industrial connections of Govt. Departments like PHED etc., shall be governed under "Amnesty Scheme" issued separately for Local Bodies & Govt. Departments.
