ORDER

Sub: Prescribing modalities for supplying power on 11 KV voltage to LT-MIP consumers in cases where maximum demand exceeds 50 KVA.

1. As per the provisions of tariff under Medium Industrial Services (Schedule MP/LT-6) consumers having sanctioned connected load above 25 HP and up to 150 HP but having maximum demand up to 50 KVA are supplied power on LT. It has also been prescribed under this tariff schedule that in case of such consumers if the recorded maximum demand in any month is more than 50 KVA (LT- MIP consumers) the consumer shall be mandatorily required to take supply on HT within one month by installing his own distribution transformer & stipulating the demand. Thus if any LT- MIP consumer has exceeded maximum demand in excess of 50 KVA in any month due to reasons beyond his control, under the prevailing provisions such consumers are required to switchover to 11 KV supply and they have to install their own distribution transformer or to take Nigam's transformer on rental basis.

2. Various Industries Associations have represented against this provision particularly where the reasons are beyond the control of the consumer.

3. The issue was placed for considerations of the coordination committee in its meeting held on 30th April, 2002 wherein it was decided that, the existing provision of requirement by LT-MIP consumers to take supply on 11 KV if maximum demand exceeds 50 KVA in any month is modified to the extent that LT-MIP consumer whose maximum demand exceeds beyond 50 KVA three times in a financial year would only be required to take supply on 11 KV. Above revised procedure will be effective from 1.4.2002.


4. It was further decided to deal with the past cases in the following manner.

(i) If any such consumer in the year 2001-2002 exceeded the maximum demand beyond 50 KVA but as per requirement of existing provision has not installed his own transformer and has been levied with transformer rent and 3% increased consumption towards billing on LT side they will continue to pay such charges upto billing month March 2002.

(ii) Such consumer(s), as mentioned at para 4(i), could be reverted back to LT supply provisions from 1.4.2002, provided they had not exceeded maximum demand beyond 50 KVA more than twice in the financial year 2001-02.

(iii) The consumers who are reverted back to LT supply as per provisions of para-4(ii) if further exceeds maximum demand beyond 50 KVA three times in the financial year 2002-03 and thereafter then such consumers will be required to take supply on 11 KV and thereafter shall not be allowed to revert back on LT supply till completion of twelve months period and reduction of connected load to the satisfaction of concerned Sub-divisional officer.
