ORDER

Sub : Deposit of cash security by Large Industrial consumers.

In accordance with the existing provisions issued vide order No. JVVNL/CMD/Dy.CE(C)/C.II/F.2 (1)/D.830 dt. 23-12-2000 (JPR5-8), the Large Industrial Consumers whose monthly consumption is Rs. 10 lacs or more, can opt for depositing the energy bills on fortnightly basis in lieu of security deposit equivalent to one month's consumption. However such consumers are required to pay the fortnightly bills by 23rd of the month in cash or by 20th through cheque and regular energy bills are required to be paid on 8th of the billing month in cash or by 5th through cheque.

The All India Induction Furnaces Association has represented that due to recession in the market they are not able to pay the bills in time and therefore, requested that the due dates for payment of above bills should be somewhat increased so that industry may survive.

The matter has been considered and looking to the genuine difficulty of industries at large, it has been decided to partially modify the provisions of existing order No. JPR5-8 dt. 23-12-2000 in above aspect to the following extent for the category of Large Industrial Consumers only :-

(i) The due dates for payment of regular energy bills :-

- (a) In cash : 15th of the month
- (b) Through cheque : 12th of the month

(ii) The due dates for payment of fortnightly bills :-

- (a) In cash : 30th of the month
- (b) Through cheque : 27th of the month

All other terms & conditions of the order No. JPR5-8 dt. 23-12-2000, shall remain unchanged. e.g. such facility shall only be available to the consumers having no outstanding dues. They will be required to execute a supplementary agreement to the effect that if they fail to deposit fortnightly bill and/or regular monthly energy bill on the due date (s), as the case may be, in the manner prescribed above, their connection could be disconnected immediately, without the requirement of seven days notice prescribed under Section 24 (1) of the Indian Electricity Act, 1910. Also, if a consumer after opting for this arrangement, defaults in making payment as stated herein above, besides disconnection, this facility will be withdrawn and such consumer will be required to pay two month security in cash and will be billed on monthly basis.

Above order shall come into force with effect from the billing month of June, 2002.
